- 4. Reading of March 5, 2022 Meeting Minutes: Joe Slezak: Pre-mailed minutes approved & passed
- 5. Treasurer's Report: Peggy Thiel

 - Workers' Comp Audit Completed

6. FOMML Endowment Report; Bob Jozwowski

- Latest report distributed to the Board.
- Flat growth in the fund... No new items to report at this time

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Dam Toe Drain Repair: Reported by Rob

- Suggested we place \$10,000 be put in the budget
- Engineers in process of determining what exact process of repairs to be made

2. Website changes: Karen and Joe

- MunicpalOne: This is the website provider for the County; Cost is \$1,500 per year
- Karen suggested that we should solicit thought as to what people want to see on the web
- Identify what the problems people are having with our current website
- Budget for preliminary amount of \$2,00 for Website Re-Design
- Archives: Joe will check out what procedure is in effect for archiving with Rescarta
- Important items have been hard-copied to a safe deposit box

3. Harvester Repair Costs: Joe

- It cost us \$16,444.00 for repairs... which was \$6,000 over the approved binding referendum.
- Joe recalled how the costs came about: \$10,000 we knew for repair costs, \$2,000 for transport costs, referendum sent to approve repair costs of \$10,000; then an additional \$2000 was added after the referendum was sent because it was discovered that the hydraulic pump needed repair when it was there.
- In addition, the \$7,000 cost for labor plus the parts will be budgeted
- We need more budgeting information on the harvester to complete the budget
- Motion made by Joe to approve the hydraulic pump repair cost for \$2,000 ... Motion passed.
- Motion made by Joe: That the cost of transportation (\$2,000) that was above the approved binding referendum be added for payment...Motion passed.
- Cory pointed out that the original estimated cost was for a low-boy trailer to load our harvester and haul it to Aquarius... instead, it was towed with our trailer to Aquarius. Joe will investigate this.

4. AIS Plan for the next two years

- Nothing will be done for the next two years
- We will probably rely on harvesting
- Fill-up date is a "one-size-fits-all" for the entire state but does not take into account the earlier ice-out of southern state lakes. Fortunately, we were able to get permission to begin refill on 5/15/2022 so the lake was available on Memorial Day weekend.

5. By-Law review: Rob Adams

- Annual Meeting: We need to prevent getting lost and focus on more efficient referendum voting
- Discussion of why changes need to be made to Article II voting, section 6 Referendum
- The way it is currently written is that we have to be given permission at the annual meeting to get an approval for the unbudgeted expense over \$5,000. Chapter 33 makes no comment about a binding conducting a binding referendum vote when unbudgeted expenses are encountered in excess of \$5.000 so that we can change it to enable such a vote.
- The quorum stated in our By-Laws, in Article VII Section 4, will be eliminated. Chapter 33 states that no quorum is required for annual meetings.
- Rob discussed the lake carrying capacity issue as one boat per 30 acres of water.

5. Annual Meeting Agenda Review

- Treasurer's Report will be printed as a handout in addition to the displayed slides
- The budget numbers should all align with the budget proposal
- Fish restocking fee costs should be put in the budget
- Establishment of a non-lapsable fund was discussed and scheduled to be proposed at the annual meeting.
- Moving of the Annual Meeting date to June to enable us to approve any grant applications
- Discussion of what it would take to conduct another drawdown. It takes 90 days to complete the permitting process.
- A June rehearsal meeting for this annual Meeting presentation will be held to prepare the agenda.
- Some discussion on land acquisition for the harvester operations... Karen will check into this.
- There is a grant that can assist us to acquire our own land for harvester operations
